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Procedures

The privilege of auditing a credit course at Finger Lakes is open to both full-time and part-time students. There is no audit provision for non-credit courses.

Course Audit

Students not eligible for senior audit status who wish to audit a course must register for the course and pay regular tuition and fees. Permission to audit must be obtained from the course instructor, where applicable. Approval to audit a course must be presented to the One Stop Center by the end of the add period. See the Grading System Policy for an explanation of the AU grade.

Senior Citizen Audit

Finger Lakes Community College welcomes senior citizens on a space available basis as determined at the close of the registration period. Permission to audit must be obtained from the course instructor. This auditing privilege is restricted to courses that are offered for college credit. Course materials or supplies needed for class not covered by normal tuition will be the responsibility of the student.
